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## Friendship Concert, Sister Cities Program Brings Japanese Student Musicians to Ann Arbor and Detroit

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The Toyota City Junior Orchestra (TCJO) will visit Southeastern Michigan this month to participate in two concert performances in Detroit and Ann Arbor.
